\*Bible Gateway.com (<http://www.Biblegateway.com>)

Among the 59 searchable English versions are the NIV (2011 & UK), NASV, The Message, New Living, KJV, English Standard, Contemporary English, NKJV, TNIV, Holman Christian Standard, and ASV.

After locating a passage of Scripture from a particular version, there is the option to see the translation of that passage in all the English version. The full text of the IVP New Testament commentaries (published in the 1990s) is available for the following books: Matthew, Luke, John, Acts, 2 Corinthians, Galatians, James, and Revelation. To access these, click on “Study Tools” and “More Resources” and then **Commentaries** and on the N.T. book you wish to read commentary for. Additional study tools are available with a subscription (3.99 a month) to Bible Gateway Plus.

Bible Study Tools (<http://www.biblestudytools.com>)

Among the searchable English versions are the NIV (2011), Good News Translation, The Message, English Standard, Holman Christian Standard, NKJV, New Living, RSV, NASV, ASV, and NRSV. Seven foreign translations (French, German, Italian, Chinese, Portuguese, Dutch & Spanish) are searchable. Can search by Scripture or term. Under “Study” is access to older commentaries (Matthew Henry, etc.), encyclopedias (including the 1939 edition of the *International Standard Bible Encyclopedia*) and dictionaries including *Baker's Evangelical Dictionary of Biblical Theology* (1996).

StudyLight.org (<http://www.studylight.org>)

Provides access to 42 searchable biblical versions, including the NIV (2011), NASV, New Living, English Standard, American Standard, Contemporary English, New Century, The Message, NKJV, RSV, NRSV, Easy-to-Read, and the Latin Vulgate with capability to search two versions at once. Some of the resources available under “Bible Study Tools” are over 100 commentaries (e.g., A. Barnes, A. Clarke, M. Henry, Calvin, Barclay, Robertson’s *Word Pictures*, Vincent’s *Word Studies*, Keil & Delitzsch on the O.T., Pulpit Commentary, Expositor’s Greek Testament and J. W. McGarvey), concordances, dictionaries (including the *Holman Bible Dictionary*, 1991 and *Baker’s Evangelical Dictionary of Biblical Theology*, 1996), encyclopedias, and lexicons.

Bible Hub ([biblehub.com](http://biblehub.com))

Provides access to 22 English versions, including the NIV (2011), New Living, ESV, God’s Word, KJV, Douay-Rheims, ASV, and Bible in Basic English. With parallel search can see verse in 19 versions and in the multilingual search can see it in over 40 modern language Bibles. Offers access to Hebrew Bible, Latin Vulgate, and Greek N.T.—all in original languages and transliterations. Has full text of the Westminster Leningrad Codex & Aleppo Codex of the Hebrew O.T. Also has translation of the Apocrypha. Definitions are given from the BDB lexicon (Hebrew) and the Easton, Hitchcock & Smith Bible dictionaries. Provides 68 commentaries including Barnes, Clarke, Ellicott, Gill, Henry (Concise commentary), Keil & Delitzsch on the O.T., Pulpit Commentary, Expositor’s Greek Testament, Geneva Study Bible, Wesley’s Notes, and Scofield reference notes. Can search atlases by location; also provides links to sermons on Bible verses.

Provides free download for 41 different translations in 22 languages to electronic devices (e.g., iPhone, iPad, Blackberry, Android, Palm, Java, Mobile Web). This is a service provided by LifeChurch.tv. Developed by YouVersion, the Bible App offers more than 1,000 Bible versions, in more than 770 languages without charge.
